Communication and language and Literacy

Listen to simple stories/have favourites and understand what is happening

Enjoy drawing freely

Say some of the words in songs and rhymes

Constantly babble and use single words during play

Understand single words in context, understand, listen and respond to simple instructions

Turn towards familiar sounds such as Key Person's voice

Gradually gain control of their bodies through large movements

Physical Development

Show an increasing desire to be independent, such as feeding and dressing

Move in ways that are appropriate to their stage of development inside and outside

Reach out for objects as coordination develops and pass to others

Sit on a push along wheeled toy, use a scooter or ride a tricycle

Explore natural materials, indoors and outside

Understanding the World

Repeat actions that have an effect

Explore materials with different properties

Becoming familiar with their new environment

Trips Local community walks

Maths

Say some number names, sometimes in order

React to changes of amounts

Combine objects like stacking blocks and cups

Complete inset puzzles

Put objects inside others and take them out again

Use engagement to achieve a goal-gesture towards a cup if they want a drink

Engage with others through gesture, gaze and talk

Establish their sense of self and express a range of emotions

Grow in independence and confidence to play on their own or with their peers

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Find ways to calm themselves and manage transitions

Express preferences and decisions and try new things

Start to develop pretend play, pretending that one object represents another

Expressive Arts and Design

Explore voices, move and dance to music, make rhythmical sounds and take part in action songs

Use senses to explore different materials

Explore paint using tools and parts of their body and give meanings to marks they make
