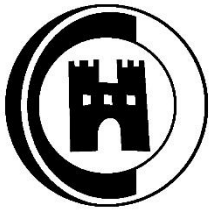


## Dymchurch and Hythe (Year 1) Home Learning Grid, Term 3

**Make sure you read your RWI book at home at least 3 times each week.**

**Complete at least 1 activity per week and colour the activity you have done using the key below.**  
*Remember you can draw, write, build, collage, etc.*

Write a character description of your favourite pirate.	Can you write a pirate poem?	Practise counting to 20. If you can already do this, practise counting backwards from 20. Tell an adult in school.	Draw and label your favourite healthy meal.
Make a collage of a pirate using different materials. Label the different materials used, and say if the materials are waterproof or not. You could add a photo of your own face so you are the pirate!	Learn your number bonds to 10 by heart. Write them and tell an adult in school.  Challenge- use your number bonds to 10 to learn your number bonds to 20.	Write out the number fact family for some of your number bonds to 10. For example: 8+2=10    10-8=2 2+8=10    10-2=8 10=8+2    2=10-8 10=2+8    8=10-2	With an adult, melt some chocolate and create a yummy treat with it. Take a photo to show your teacher.
Draw some treasure chests. Make one of them full, one empty, one nearly empty, one nearly full. Label each one.	Make some pirate biscuits, enjoy them with your family. Take a photo to show your teacher!	Write your own pirate story. Can you remember our model text? This will help you.	Find out about a famous pirate and write some facts about them.
Write your weekend news, using full stops and capital letters. Make sure you also use clear finger spaces. Use Fred-fingers for spelling your words.	Learn a pirate song to share with your class.	Make up your own pirate maths word problems (e.g. 6 pirates were on one ship, 4 pirates were on another ship. How many pirates altogether?)	Design a pirate treasure map, showing where the treasure is, where the pirates are. Add a simple compass at the side, showing directions.
